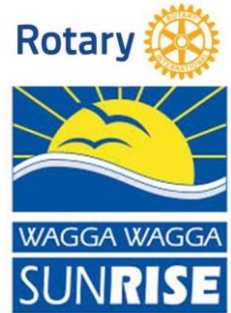

Deidre Tome introduced Amali and Emily, Year 12 students at Koorling High School, who had attended the NYSF in January in Canberra with financial support from the club.

Emily had selected the chemistry focus area, and found the lab visits of great interest, where the students assessed the air and water quality of the lake, and were amazed at the poor results.



Amali found her nominated area, engineering, had unexpected links to international patent law and the communication of engineering concepts to the general public.

Attendance at NYSF had inspired them to concentrate more on their studies and give back to the community.

Both students expressed their deepest appreciation to Sunrise and encouraged club members to continue supporting the program, a call echoed by Head Teacher (Science) **Nim Weerakoon**, not only in funding but also in providing the interview practice for applicants.

The Rotary Foundation is Rotary's own charity and is an endowment fund devoted to 'doing good in the world'. Over the last 100 years, it has spent over \$3 billion on humanitarian programs across the world.

At least 7 million children under the age of five die each year from malnutrition, poor health care, and inadequate sanitation. Did you know 80% of maternal deaths could be prevented by access to reproductive health services and trained health care workers?

In the Maternal and Child Health focus area, Australian Rotarians have supported international and international projects. Box Hill RC is providing toilets for schools and surrounding communities in school-led sanitation programs. Macquarie Park RC has raised money to buy a car for the family of a 12 year old child, severely disabled by a rare genetic disorder.
